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Dr. Robert Tanguay is a psychiatrist with dual fellowships in addiction and pain medicine. He is a clinical assistant professor in the departments of psychiatry and surgery at the Cumming School of Medicine, University of Calgary. Dr. Tanguay serves as the senior medical director, addiction services, for Recovery Alberta, and is the co-founder and co-developer of Alberta's Community Rapid Access Addiction Medicine (RAAM) clinics, where he continues to practice clinically. He is a member of the Calgary Police Commission, providing leadership on budget, governance, and policy to support effective and accountable policing. Nationally, Dr. Tanguay serves as co-chair of the Western Canadian Addiction Forum, chair of the Canadian Addiction Council, and a founding director of the Canadian Academy of Addiction Psychiatry. His contributions have been recognized with numerous honours, including the Royal College Early Career Leadership Award, induction into the University of Lethbridge Alumni Honour Society, the University of Calgary Department of Psychiatry Keith Pierce Award for Innovation, the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal, and the King Charles III Coronation Medal. Dr. Tanguay's research focuses on trauma, addiction, chronic pain, opioids, cannabis and psychedelics. He is a member of both the Hotchkiss Brain Institute and the Mathison Centre for Mental Health Research and Education at the University of Calgary.
